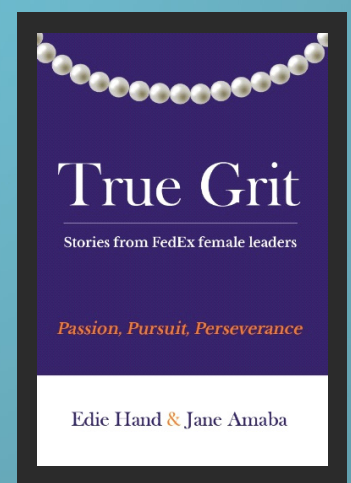
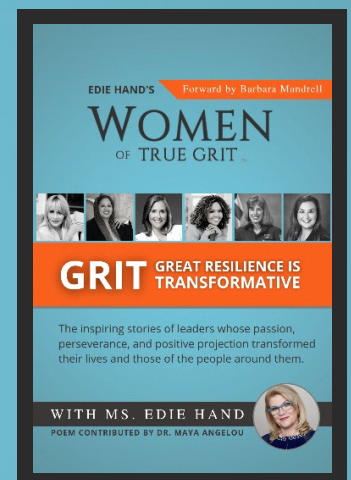

CeCe Winans is considered to be the biggest-selling and most-awarded female gospel music artist of all time. Recording and performing as both a solo artist and as a duo with her brother BeBe, CeCe has influenced a generation of gospel and secular vocalists throughout her career. She has received twelve Grammy Awards, twenty Dove Awards, and seven Stellar Awards. She has been inducted into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame in addition to being named a Trailblazer of Soul by BMI and receiving multiple NAACP Image Awards, Soul Train Awards, Essence Awards. She is the author of three books and has touched millions more with inspirational performances everywhere from Oprah to The White House, and even showed off her acting chops on television series like “7th Heaven” and “Doc.” She also founded, with her husband, Alvin Love II, Nashville Life Church in Nashville, Tennessee.



Astronaut Jan Davis Ph.D. is a veteran of three space flights, has made 445 orbits around Earth traveling more than 11 million miles, and has logged over 673 hours in space. Davis received her bachelor’s degree in applied biology from the Georgia Institute of Technology and another in mechanical engineering from Auburn University. She later earned a Master of Science degree and then a doctorate, both in mechanical engineering, at the University of Alabama in Huntsville. She has been awarded the NASA Outstanding Leadership Medal, the NASA Exceptional Service Medal (twice), and the NASA Space Flight Medal (three times), in addition to other awards. She has been inducted into the Alabama Aviation Hall of Fame and the Alabama Engineering Hall of Fame. After retiring from NASA, she worked for Jacobs Engineering and Bastion Technologies, Inc. as the Safety and Mission Assurance Support Contract Program Manager at the Marshall Space Flight Center.



Sheila Erwin is the mother of successful movie producers/directors Andrew and Jon Erwin who has produced some of the top faith-based films including *I Can Only Imagine* which collectively grossed more than \$120 million worldwide; Sheila is well known for her accomplishments too. She is the author of the book *Raising Up Dreamers: Find and Grow Your Child's God-Given Talents*. For nearly 50 years, she's been involved in a variety of ministries, with a particular passion for investing in the lives of other women through discipleship, speaking at events, one-on-one mentoring, and group Bible study. Sheila also worked as a teacher and then as a principal at a Christian school before stepping down from the role to become a stay-at-home mom. She and her husband, Hank, have two grown sons who are married, and seven grandchildren.



Victoria Hallman was one of the popular Hee Haw Honeys, on the Hee Haw television show, Victoria worked her way into the hearts of millions of TV viewers. The show which ran from 1969 to 1997 was so popular for its family-friendly content, that it continues in syndication to this day. Alabama native, born in Mobile, Victoria Hallman as a child entered in a Shirley Temple look-alike contest on WAPI-TV in Birmingham. The host of the show thought that Victoria's singing talent was such that he set up an audition at Heart Recording Studio, and within two years Victoria was in Nashville, signed to a record contract. After moving to California she had a chance to meet with Buck Owens. Before she knew it, she was in a dressing room singing 'Help Me Make it Through the Night' for Buck, and just as suddenly she was on stage performing the song, backed by Buck and the Buckaroos. Owens hired her as his opening act and later as a female vocalist with the Buckaroos. Then came Hee Haw. Victoria would be a regular as one of the Hee Haw Honeys from 1979-1990. Remember Miss Honeydew? That was Victoria.
